Harding, **David Pichette** (5<sup>th</sup> Avenue Theatre's *The Pajama Game*) as Henry Ford and **Kevin Pitman** (Taproot Theatre's *Busman's Honeymoon*) as Colonel Edmund Starling.

Following *Camping with Henry and Tom* is Regina Taylor's *Crowns*. Faith Bennett Russell (Taproot Theatre's *A Civil War Christmas*) will direct the ensemble cast.
