

World Premiere musical based on Jane Austen's *Persuasion* at Taproot Theatre

SEATTLE, WA – March 24, 2017 – **Taproot Theatre Company** is proud to produce the World Premiere production of **Harold Law** and **Chris Jeffries'** musical based on Jane Austen's *Persuasion*. The beloved novel has been transformed into a breathtaking new musical filled with love, laughter and second chances. The production will play on Taproot's Jewell Mainstage this July 12 through August 19. Taproot's Associate Artistic Director, Karen Lund, will helm this new work and direct an all-star cast of Seattle's musical theatre giants.

Persuasion is a 2015 product of The 5th Avenue Theatre's inaugural *NextFest: A Festival of New Musicals*. It has since been workshopped at the Texas Musical Theatre Workshop in 2016.

"Hope is the most tenacious thing." Jane Austen's final novel soars to life in this ravishing new musical about love, longing and second chances. Years ago, Anne Elliot was persuaded to abandon true love but now her past mistakes and long-lost hopes have returned. Can she summon the courage to follow her heart?

Harold Law is a novelist, playwright, screenwriter, and layabout multi-form writer. His debut novel was *Adventures of the Karaoke King* (Lake Union Publishing 2011). His writing has been featured on NPR, in a *New York Times* bestselling anthology and in *The Seattle Times*; his screenplay *Dog Park* has garnered recognition in domestic and international film festivals and competitions. Harold wrote the book for two musicals presented as staged readings by The 5th Avenue Theatre: the full-length *Persuasion: A New Musical* (2015), based on Jane Austen's final novel, which also had a workshop reading at Texas Musical Theatre Workshop; and the original one-act *The Missed Connections Club* (2014), which won Third Place in the 2015 Frostburg State University One-Act Competition, was a finalist in the Arts Club of Washington's 2014 One-Act Play Competition, and was longlisted for the 2015 British Theatre Challenge. A Yale Law School graduate and a Fulbright Scholar, Harold's research and writing have been supported by, among others, 826 Seattle, Artist Trust, Centrum, the Helen Riaboff Whiteley Center, Humanities Washington, Jack Straw Productions and Wing Luke Museum.

Chris Jeffries has written book, music and lyrics for *Vera Wilde* and *Moon of My Delight* (Empty Space Theatre); *Kaleidoscope Eyes* (Northwest Film Forum); and *The Glory Booty Club* (Garland Award); *I See London, I See France*; *Radio Pirates*; and *The Fatty Arbuckle Spook House Revue* (Annex Theatre, Footlight Award). *Fatty* was later produced at Yale School of Drama. *Vera Wilde* has been produced throughout the U.S. and abroad, most recently in Berkeley (four SFBATCC awards). Music/lyrics credits include *Laura Comstock's Bag-Punching Dog* (Los Angeles, Ovation and LA Weekly Awards, Best Musical) and *Horse Opera* (Seattle, Minneapolis, Washington; NEA Consortium Grant). His music for *Bunnacula* (Kennedy Center/Seattle Children's Theatre) has been heard in dozens of productions in the U.S. and Canada. He is under commission by A Contemporary Theatre (ACT) for a musical based on Jack Kerouac's *Maggie Cassidy*. Chris received *The Stranger's* first Genius Award in Theatre

and was twice a finalist for CalArts' Alpert Award in the Arts. A graduate of Yale University, he lives in Seattle, Washington.

Karen Lund's other directing credits at Taproot include *Godspell*, *Jane Eyre*, *A Charlie Brown Christmas* and *Illyria*. She is currently serving as the President of the Board of Directors for Theatre Puget Sound.

Michael Nutting returns to music direct at Taproot, after serving in the same position for *Joyful Noise*. He served as the Associate Music Director on 2014 ACT/5th Avenue Theatre collaboration, *Little Shop of Horrors*. Other credits include *Sweet Charity* and *A Christmas Carol* (Seattle Musical Theatre) and *Messiah* (The Inverse Opera).

Cayman Ilika (ACT/5th Avenue's *Jacques Brel is Alive and Well...*) leads the cast as Anne Elliot; accompanying her on her journey to find true love are **Matthew Posner** (5th Avenue Theatre's *How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying*) as Captain Wentworth, **Chelsea LeValley** (Village Theatre's *A Proper Place*) as Henrietta Musgrove/Elizabeth Elliot, **Ryan Childers** (Village Theatre's *My Fair Lady*) as Charles Musgrove/Mr. Shepherd, **Sophia Franzella** (Village Theatre's *A Proper Place*) as Louisa Musgrove, **Randy Scholz** (Village Theatre's *A Proper Place*) as Captain Benwick/Mr. William Walter Elliot, **Kate Jaeger** (Village Theatre's *Les Misérables*) as Mary Musgrove and **Nick DeSantis** (5th Avenue Theatre's *Man of La Mancha*) as Sir Walter Elliot/Captain Harville.
